Scripture: Luke 6:46-49



How Far Are You Willing to Dig?

*Read today's scriptures:

It is said that in the days of Jesus, people would go and prepare their homes during the dry months of winter. One of the main reasons is the fact that they would be able to dig deep into the ground until they hit something solid that they could build on. If they were able to dig deep enough, they would be able to build on a solid foundation that could withstand the test of the many storms that would soon come in the spring. On the other hand, other builders who did not take the time to apply this knowledge, would go and build a house on adobe mud. In digging only past the surface they would find good dirt in which to build. The only problem with dirt is that when it is mixed with the rain waters you can only imagine why the house would fall.

In reading our scripture verses today, my question to you is how far have you been willing to dig. As we are moving through the 35 days left in our Family Faith Connection Phase 2 and continuing to try and grow our families stronger in their relationship with God... how far have you actually dug to begin your foundation? One of the hardest things is that we are only willing to give God the least amount possible that makes us feel good and adequate about our relationships. But you guessed it... we literally are acting like the foolish man who is only willing to dig deep enough to feel as though we can start building instead of spending the time to dig deeper until we hit a SOLID foundation.

*How far have you dug?

*What would happen if the storms of life surrounded your family? Would you be able to withstand the storm or would your house be destroyed?

*How solid is the foundation of your family members?

*Have you been preparing them to dig deeper or are you teaching them the same example of digging only surface deep?

God help us to keep digging. Help us to not give up because the road may be too difficult, but realize the stronger and more solid the foundation, the more stable our lives, our houses, our families will be. Teach me to dig and not be satisfied with a shallow foundation. AMEN
