I know that we take our time daily to give to God, but my question is do we give out of our fullness and our best, or do we give out of the leftovers and the reserves. Today we begin the next 60 day journey and I am asking you to think of your family first when it comes to giving God the best. You will be asked to be more hands on and take time to study and answer questions. Don't take this lightly. Give it your full attention and take hold of EVERYTHING that you can to help connect your family back to being the family unit God created it to be. FIGHT LIKE IT'S YOUR LAST OPPORTUNITY. GIVE IT ALL YOU HAVE... WELCOME TO PHASE 2.

The following questions are for everyone who follows Christ. Whether 5 or 75, we all frequently in need to recommit ourselves and our resources to him. Dig deep and journal about them. Connect with others. Help each other process and pray through the questions and challenges. After you've arrived at some conclusions, continue praying for and supporting each other.

\*What tempts you to think that you don't have what it takes to accomplish God's mission for your family?

\*What do you wish you could do for God and others, but are afraid to do?

\*What thoughts and emotions do you wrestle with?

\*How many loaves (gifts/talents) do you have? How might God honor your smallseeming gift?

\*What is he asking your to do for Him as it related to your family this week? Why will this be of value?

\*What support do you need from others this week? What do they need from you?

<sup>\*</sup>Read todays scriptures:

As we start phase 2, just know that we are really asking you to not just think about what you are able to get from this daily time to focus on your family, but what are you willing to give. We have been creating within you, opportunities to connect with your family. We will continue to equip you over the days and months, but we will also ask you to think outside the box and begin taking ownership of the spiritual direction and leadership of your family. This is exactly what God intended because God gave you your children and believed so much in you that he gave you these loaves, your children as a blessing and opportunity to help direct and mold their lives. It's never going to be easy, but understand, when we come with our hands open in humility and obedience, God is able to take our gifts and use them to change the world. So it was with the loaves and fishes... so will it be with your child/children. God is ready to do so much with just a test of obedience from us.

### Prayer:

Lord, when I let myself dream, I get really pumped about all the things I'd like to do for you, and for people. For example....(Fill in the Blank)... \*Read todays scriptures:



As we are moving through our Family Faith Connection Series, it amazes me how many of our students have a hard time truly understanding the fullness of Christ. It is a harder time for students to truly grasp the God in flesh, but going through this time of isolation is a great time to have a discussion with your family about Jesus. One of the coolest things that happened to me this last year during our confirmation weekend was that their parents wrote them a letter of encouragement. Do you know that for most of them that was the first time they had ever heard their parents talk to them about their spiritual journey. Some of the students in the room were even amazed that their parents had a deeper understand of God and church. It was not just something that they did, but it was something that they really believed.

I find that very interesting. Why do we continue to say that we love our students, but sometimes fail to spend time asking the tough but not really tough question about if they know and believe in Jesus? So my first question for you today is this, do you know beyond the shadow of a doubt that your son/daughter knows Jesus. Not just the church answer about Jesus, but truly understands why the life of Jesus was so important to the future of the world. Second, have you ever talked about your spiritual journey and your relationship with Christ to your children? Wait.. hold on... that just got real... Yes it did! How can you expect your students to ever fully understand anything about Jesus if it is not be talked about or modeled as an example at home. Home is where God called us to be the example for our students. So, I am asking today that as you go through these questions, take the time and maybe even discuss these as a family. Share YOUR testimony with your family. Let them know how you came to know Christ and it wasn't just a confirmation experience, but a continued life journey with Jesus. Ups and Downs... victories and struggles. Be Real and help them to experience the love, grace and mercy of Jesus in a totally different way.. through your story.

Think about these questions, talk with God, and journal about them. When you meet with your family, share your thoughts and feelings honestly. Pray together for true knowledge of Jesus, no matter how old you are, and do what you can to help each other find them.

\*What's the difference between knowing Jesus and knowing about Jesus?

\*What's the difference between knowing Jesus and doing the good things He says to do?

\*If someone asked you how to start a relationship with Jesus, what would you say?

\*Do you know the Son of Man? You can pray to Him now, using the following prayer or any words that convey the same ideas. Then you'll have His presence in you, helping you live the life you've always really wanted.

Jesus, I've done wrong things, and I don't deserve forgiveness or heaven. Thank you for dying for me. I accept your forgiveness, your free gift of eternal life. Change me inside, and help me live for you. Thank you for this miracle in me. Now do miracles through me. And if you know Jesus... Lord, thank you for being in my life. Never let me take you for granted. Pull me and my family closer to you. Let us actually feel like we're starving when we neglect you, so we'll seek you with all our hearts. Live through us and change our world. AMEN



Why Did You Doubt?





One of the biggest struggles in this journey truly is the doubt that many of us have as it surrounds our lives. We continue to doubt that we are smart enough or good enough or can even fully understand who our students are and the decisions we need to make to equip them or prepare them for life. It's doubt. We stare at it every day when we look in the mirror, and continue to question everything when our worlds seem to be collapsing in around us. However, sometimes doubt can be a powerful source that helps to lead us out of our comfort zones. As I watch my children continue to grow up right before my eyes, sometimes the doubt that is in their lives causes them to have to reach out and depend only on Jesus to make it to the next step of their faith journey. When we cannot even see the light at the end of the tunnel, we continue to question if God really knows what is happening in the midst of the uncertainty and chaos that we may be right in the middle of right now. Breathe, God knows where you are and trust me, has already walked a mile or more ahead of you to prepare for your journey of full dependence on Him and not in this world. Today as you walk in your faith journey, the scriptures and the questions are going to challenge you to think about where you are in this so called life. Yesterday you were challenged to spend time talking to your family about faith.. well it's just as powerful to sit down and help them see and understand our journeys through doubt and how the struggle is real. How we live our lives in the presence of God in hopes of placing all of our doubts and fears at the foot of the cross and taking a step out of the proverbial boat by faith. SO spend some time today discerning your biggest doubts and fears and talk about how through those moments, God was able to direct your path. Even when you may have not realized it in the immediate moment, but you were able to see His prevenient grace when you looked back with 20/20 vision to see how God was there every step of the way.

Another day, a BIGGER challenge. Don't face it alone. Connect with your family soon, and share encouragement, accountability, and prayers. Connect with God about these questions and journal your responses.

\*Don't wait for fear to disappear. Fear isn't the opposite of faith. Disobedience is. What step will you take to show faith in spite of fear this week?

Lord, it's hard to admit that i doubt you. I do. (Share your doubts). Thanks for understanding. And thanks for not letting me stay stuck. Give me the will to obey, no matter how I feel. And when we've won a victory, let me feel your smile. I know that my family are also feeling doubts about (fill in the blank).. Please give them courage to overcome too. AMEN

So today we are working on finishing our first week of Phase 2. The struggle is still the shift from being equipped by someone to taking opportunities to self-reflect and step out on faith. The personal reflection of Christ in your faith is something that is huge. It's not easy because so many times we ask the question of whether or not we feel qualified to answer a deep theological question or do we need to go the pastor for answers. That is the cool part.. you can do both. A huge step in one's growth process is being able to take the opportunity to try and discern what God is speaking to you. Funny thing is, what God may be saying to you in one scripture, God can be saying something totally different to someone else when they read the same scripture. That's the power of the Holy Spirit. It is the way in which God starts to work with our inmost thoughts and desires.

When God knit us together, God was preparing for the moment when we would once again invite Him back into His creation to stake claim over our lives. In the daily moments that we pause and take time to get to know God, do you ever ask yourself the question, Don't you know me now? As God has probably asked that question so many times looking into our lives, I wonder how many times we ask that question of God. The answer is YES. Yes God knows us because God is part of us. Yes, God knows our thoughts, actions, and even the days of our lives. As you think through that for a second, think about this as well. How long have you been going to church or how long have you known or heard "about" God? See that's a different question but with HUGE Kingdom potential. See many of our students have truly heard and know "about" God, but don't fully "KNOW" God. What's the difference. Well I know of the Grand Canyon because I have read about it in geography and history. I have seen pictures, but to truly say that I "know" or have had the ability to see the Grand Canyon with my own eyes is something I have not fully experienced. The same is true with God. Many people have heard stories and seen images and heard and at some point read the Bible, but until they fully know God for themselves, it's just something they "know of" or "know about" and not something they are intimately attached to because of a personal experience.

So today that is what I am asking you to do. Spend a little time really getting to know and getting intimate with God. And hopefully you can share that experience with your family. Because all of our families are at different stages of knowing God. So it's ok if we tell our stories to help them out a little. As you dig into and journal about these questions, picture Jesus there talking with you. Absorb the love, power, and truth of His presence. Renew your commitment to seek Him each day. Share your commitment with your family, and prayerfully support each other.

\*What are some ways you've seen and come to know Jesus personally in your time with Him this week?

\*What differences has this vision of Him made in your attitudes and way of living?

\*In what ways do you need to open your eyes to Jesus, take a fresh look at Him, revive your relationship with Him?

\*What's one step you'll take now to see and know Jesus better?

Jesus, I want to see You. I want the fulfillment of a deep friendship with the God of everything, the central character of all human history. You. I know I have disappointed You at times, neglecting You, running from You, pretending to be Your friend when I've been more like a stranger to You. I'm sorry. Give me hunger to know you through your Word and prayer. And give me awareness to see Your hand and heart in people and events around me. I pray for the same hunger and sensitivity in my family. \*Consider your fitness to God's mission. What one specific healing of sin, emotions, or body would you request?


\*Once you've prayed for this, how can you step out in faith that the Healer has granted it, will grant it over time, or will enable you to live well even with this injury?

\*Brainstorm several benefits of living for God. Consider how much each of them really means.

\*Selling out is risky. How does God promise to reimburse, protect, and strengthen you? \*Write your gift list to God. What does "everything" include in your life? \*How will you go about giving Him His first gift from your list?

(GULP) Everything Lord? And carry a cross to my own execution? This is really tough. The only reason I'm considering it is because of You. Selling out doesn't make total sense to me. But Your steady love, Your flawless wisdom, Your absolute power—these are starting to make sense. And the huge cost is starting to look smaller in comparison to You. I want to be Your disciple. Give me desire to accept the cost. I want to learn to pay it gladly. Show me Your hand at work. Give me reassurance and confidence. And do the same for my family.. Show us how to help each other stay sold out for You. AMEN

As you wrestle with these questions, be especially honest. With God...with your family...with yourself. Use your journal as a sounding board. Use your family as a source of prayer and encouragement. And be the same for them.

- \*A huge number of people, young and old, have emotional and spiritual illnesses and wounds inside. Pain from abuse, rejection, or neglect. Horrible self-images. Destructive habits and addictions. Depression... A lot of people prefer to stay sick. Why? What good do they thing they're getting out of their condition?
- \*Do you know someone who doesn't want to get well? Don't mention names. How might Jesus try talking them into accepting healing?
- \*How about you? Are you resisting God's healing in some way? Do you know why?
- \*How might your life be different if you let Him make you well?
- \*What specific steps would lead to your healing? Consider for example prayer, confessions, accountability, learning God's truth, getting counseling, or rehab. What do you want to do first?

Lord You've taken care of me in so many ways. (Thank Him for specifics). But I've held back some of my favorite wounds and sicknesses from Your healing touch. I don't completely understand my weird attachment to them. But here they are. (Open them up to Him). I do want to be well. Completely well. Give me patience with the time it takes. Give me courage for the obedience it takes. Give me humility to be vulnerable and honest. And give me confidence that you still love me, no matter what I dig up inside. Fix me, so I can know You and serve You better. Please help my family in their times of struggle as well. AMEN

Should I Beg For Escape?

\*Read todays scriptures:



When life knocks you down, take God's sympathetic hand and let Him help you up. When you can't get up, He lies down and hurts with you; feel His comfort. And when you think your nightmare is eternal, scream to God and hang onto Him; He'll bring morning light in time. Today's questions might stir some frightening memories or worries for you, whether you're young or old. Give yourself a break if you need it. And keep in close touch with someone you trust. (Watch for others, also, who might need to lean on you).

\*Describe a time when you've wished desperately that God, or someone, would rescue You from Your pain. (Maybe right now.) How can both honesty about your pain and genuine faith in God work together in those times?

\*How long did it take you to heal, if you ever did? What helped? What didn't?

\*No one can escape fear and grief when enduring a loss. But brainstorm some ways you can prepare during the easier seasons of life, so you'll hang onto both God and hope when you have to ride out the hard times.

\*What's one step you will take this week to prepare for a future crisis, or make it through one right now?

Lord, when the bottom drops out and I'm in freefall, nothing makes sense. Help me connect closer with you every day, so that in those times at least You make sense to me. Teach me to hang onto You no matter what. Teach me to be completely honest with You. You can handled even my most harsh and despairing thoughts. (If you ned to, share your honest thoughts and feelings now.) Come to me also with silent comfort. (If you're hurting now, you don't have to use words. Just know His presence for a while. Take as long as you need.) I know, lord, that my family are hurting and scared. Let them feel Your comfort. AMEN



And if others frown on my service for You, give them insight to guide and encourage me. But give me also respect for the human authorities You've placed in my life. \*When you pray, do you think God is listening? Do you think He cares about your requests? Why or Why not?

\*There are a variety of ways to communicate with God. Take a minute and brainstorm creativity about ways that might work best for you. (Think about all the ways people communicate- speaking, writing, body language, art, music, actions and more. How might you use these for relating to God?)

\*What are a couple of God honoring desires you want more than anything else?

\*What is your strategy for bringing these requests regularly to God? What is your first step?

Lord, You're always there. Amazing! And You're better than hanging out with a movie star or sports hero. You can do anything. You know everything, and You never stop loving me. So why don't I connect with You more? I want to. I will. Create in my heart a hunger to be with You. Help me be patient for that hunger to grow, so I don't give up when prayer doesn't come easy. Do the same thing for my family. Give them more and more joy in your presence every day. AMEN

\*The mere doing is good and loving, but how can you cultivate a heart that honestly wants to?

\*What's your first step?

No, Lord, not me. Please don't ask me to love her. Okay, I've been honest. That's how I feel (forgive me.) Now change me. I want to love everyone You love. I want to love the way You love, for the reasons You love. I want to love no matter what. And I want to love with action. Show me how. Give me courage. Help me get over myself, my fears, and my pride. Help me do miracles in a life that needs You. Please also help my family to love all kinds of people in their lives. Fill them with Your heart, with Your sight, with Your touch of healing love. AMEN

\*What does Jesus honestly think and feel about the times you fail Him?


\*What's the way of dealing with your failures that makes Jesus happiest?

Are we...or are we finding ourselves once again going through the motions to just get to the end so that we can say that we finished?

In the scriptures today, we see the harsh reality that none of us would give our children something as vile as a snake or a stone in place of bread or fish. But in not spending the time to help them dig deeper into the Word of God and just playing the game to get it over... that's exactly what we are doing. We are telling them that God is not important... go watch TV, or our family time is not important so just go spend time in your room, or doing something else instead of bothering me. When Jesus talks about the narrow gate, He is speaking to us about the fact that many are unwilling to take the time to learn and to teach the foundational truths to their family, and then they ask why is our family falling apart. All throughout Matthew 7 you hear the voice of God in the stories Jesus is telling about the dire importance of teaching others about the Word of God.

\*In your family time, are you willing to dig deeper with your family in hopes of building a stronger foundation for their lives?

\*What are you giving them... stones that are hard and dead or bread of life? Are you teaching them to fish or praying they are not bitten by satan's snakes?

\*Which door, road or gate is your family heading towards?

# Read Scripture Verses:

Once we begin to see the differences of our old life and the new one that is before us, we always question what we have gained and what we have lost. In looking to the world I was amazed to find an AWESOME voice from God is the midst of all the chaos. Of you missed this commercial during the Super Bowl I want to encourage you as a family to go back and watch it on YouTube. The title... God Made A Farmer. It blows my mind that in the chaos and glitz of one the most widely watched events in modern day era, God was able to show up and show out. Never would I have ever imagined that Dodge Chryslar would be willing to spend 3.5 million dollars on an add whose main focus was God and the hands that are bruised and broken to help this country thrive. I was completely blown away!

Which brings me to the point of our study today. Has God called you to be a farmer? For many of us we say that there is no way that we could make the long hours, fight the despair and desperation of the years that it takes to grow a crop that will produce a harvest. Many of us are unwilling to work from sun up to sun down just so that we can prepare the fields..day in and day out with no yield or thank you.. We prepare the fields for rain and we plow the grow to find rich soil in hopes that something might actually take root and grow. But you see the hours I'm asking you to work are not with a plow or hoe... It's not with a tiller or pick ax... It's the farmers greatest tool given by the greatest farmer we know. The Bible. Filled with plenty of nourishment and good soil that is prepped and ready to be planted into a field that could yield millions. What is your return for the hours you continue to plant and prepare.. Will you have a yield at all?

- \*How long each day are you preparing your personal fields for the harvest?
- \*Are you still praying for God's rain to fall on you and your family?
- \*Are you willing to take the time to nurture, weed, feed and harvest the Word of God into the lives of your family?
- \*Are you willing to invest now so that you will be able to see a yield 100 times greater?

God, continue to help me to thrive to be a farmer. Help me to desire to reach out to my family and help them to pass on the ability to prepare the fields for the seasons that lie ahead. Help to prepare my heart in hopes of receiving Your Word as a seed that must have something to take root AMEN

Worry a problem we all face...

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# Read Scripture Verses:

Worry is a state of anxiety and uncertainty over actual or potential problems.

As humans we typically tend to worry about any and everything. We worry about important and unimportant things. We worry about failure and success. We worry about what people think and don't think. We worry about money. We worry what our kids are doing. Our kids worry about sports, school, friends, boyfriend, girlfriend, peer pressure, social status, and what their parents think. We let worrying drive us CRAAAAAZZZZYYY! Worry worry worry is all we do.

Retread Matthew 6:25. Therefore I tell you do not worry about your life. If we spend all of our time worrying there will be no time to live life. We are so scared of failure that we worry about everything. God did not create us to live our lives in fear. He made us wonderfully and perfectly. He made us to be successful even when we fail. Worrying is uncertainty and when you accept Jesus Christ into your life there should be no uncertainty. Verse 34 says therefore do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will worry about itself. Each day has enough trouble of its own.

Worry can cause separation in your family. The parents worry and get stressed out. They worry about their children and lose trust in them. Children worry so much of how their parents will react and think that it forms a barrier of communication between them. God did not give us hearts to worry or brains to worry he gave us faith hope and love. Worry takes away time that you should be focused on the people in your family. We should not worry about the future because verses like Jeremiah 29:11 give us comfort that god has everything under control and a future of greatness.

Reread Matthew 6:31-32.

God knows what you need and when you need it so stop worrying and let God do his job.

Dear God, please help me and my family not worry about all the things that we do. Let us take that time we would normally spend worrying and use it to spend time with each other. Help us not to build barriers between one another and to understand that you give us faith hope and love and that all three of these things out weigh worry. Help us live our lives without uncertainty because as a family living for god we have accepted you into our hearts and you do not give us any uncertainty. In your name we pray, Amen.

# \*Read todays scriptures:

As we are moving through the 35 days left in our Family Faith Connection Phase 2 and continuing to try and grow our families stronger in their relationship with God... how far have you actually dug to begin your foundation? One of the hardest things is that we are only willing to give God the least amount possible that makes us feel good and adequate about our relationships. But you guessed it... we literally are acting like the foolish man who is only willing to dig deep enough to feel as though we can start building instead of spending the time to dig deeper until we hit a SOLID foundation.

\*How far have you dug?

\*What would happen if the storms of life surrounded your family? Would you be able to withstand the storm or would your house be destroyed?

\*How solid is the foundation of your family members?

\*Have you been preparing them to dig deeper or are you teaching them the same example of digging only surface deep?

God help us to keep digging. Help us to not give up because the road may be too difficult, but realize the stronger and more solid the foundation, the more stable our lives, our houses, our families will be. Teach me to dig and not be satisfied with a shallow foundation. AMEN

More than half would end up taking home a horse, or donkey, or some broken down car as the treasure they had was never good enough.

Is that how we feel with God's love? I think it's funny that we have this amazing gift that is free and it seems as though every moment or chance we get we want something more. Today you have literally smacked us in the face and helped us to realize that we don't just exchange seasons to be with you with seasons we want to go out way. We reap what we sow and God I pray You will give me strength to hold onto the love in my family and not trade it for the world. Amen

It is a sign of honor and prestige to anyone who receives such valuable information. A Signet Ring is only created specifically for that King, Queen or even Pope. Once they die, the ring is destroyed and new ring is fashioned for the person who is to take their place as the authority of the realm.

Today, we are reading that God has once again spoken to the prophet Haggai and given him a very significant role in the history of the kingdom. Haggai is given the honor of telling the ruling body of the country that a new King is going to be pronounced... Zerubbabel, and with this announcement, kingdoms that are not with God will falter and fail. God is beginning to restore the kingdom of Judah and Israel back to one united kingdom of God instead of 2 diverse kingdoms trying to destroy each other. Sort of like the Baptist/Methodist feud that has been going on for ages. In doing so, God is saying that Zerubbabel is going to be his Signet Ring, or God's authoritative voice for the people of Judah and Israel. Does Evil Exist?



### \*Read todays scriptures:

Something I read the other day I wanted to pass along based on our discussion of God.

Does evil exist?

The university professor challenged his students with this question. Did God create everything that exists? A student bravely replied yes, he did!"
"God created everything?" The professor asked.

"Yes, sir," the student replied. The professor answered, "If God created everything, then God created evil since evil exists, and according to the principal that our works define who we are then God is evil." The student became quiet before such an answer.

The professor was quite pleased with himself and boasted to the students that he had proven once more that the Christian faith was a myth. Another student raised his hand and said, "Can I ask you a question professor?" "Of course", replied the professor. The student stood up and asked, "Professor, does cold exist?" "What kind of question is this? Of course it exists. Have you never been cold?" The students snickered at the young man's question. The young man replied, "In fact sir, cold does not exist. According to the laws of physics, what we consider cold is in reality the absence of heat. Everybody and every object is susceptible to study when it has or transmits energy, and heat is what makes a body or matter have or transmit energy. Absolute zero (- 460 degrees F) is the total absence of heat; all matter becomes inert and incapable of reaction at that temperature. Cold does not exist. We have created this word to describe how we feel if we have too little heat.

The student continued. "Professor, does darkness exist?" The professor responded, "Of course it does". The student replied, "Once again you are wrong sir, darkness does not exist either. Darkness is in reality the absence of light. Light we can study, but not darkness. In fact we can use Newton's prism to break white light into many colors and study the various wavelengths of each color. You cannot measure darkness. A simple ray of light can break into a world of darkness and illuminate it. How can you know how dark a certain space is? You measure the amount of light present. Isn't this correct? Darkness is a term used by man to describe what happens when there is no light present."

Finally the young man asked the professor. "Sir, does evil exist?" Now uncertain, the professor responded, "Of course as I have already said. We see it every day. It is in the daily example of man's inhumanity to man. It is in the multitude of crime and violence everywhere in the world. "These manifestations are nothing else but evil." To this the student replied, "Evil does not exist sir, or at least it does not exist unto itself. Evil is simply the absence of God. It is just like darkness and cold, a word that man has created to describe the absence of God. God did not create evil. Evil is not like faith, or love, that exist just as does light and heat. Evil is the result of what happens when man does not have God's love present in his heart. It's like the cold that comes when there is no heat or the darkness that comes when there is no light."

The professor sat down.

God may we too be able to answer with authority the power of your existence. May we be sure in our faith as we continue to teach out family truth! Direct our paths and help us to be prepared always and everywhere to give an answer for who You are. AMEN

Here is a family action point for this week. For 20 minutes this week I would like for your family to work on their listening skills. I would love for you to sit down with each member of your family and honestly ask them how things are going and before you tune out. Write it down... Ask them what they are struggling with and write it down. Yes, this may seem like a session with a psychiatrist, but maybe there are some small details that God is trying to reveal to you through your family and we are not taking the time to listen. As we are past the midpoint of our Lent, we are beginning to move back into our family habits of trying to spend time together. Beginning next week we will once again be requiring that you spend time together as a family on a weekly basis. We are kicking it up another notch in hopes of using this time over the Summer to truly strengthen our families. It all starts here.. Are you ready?

God, please open my ears to hear Your word. Give me a desire to want to listen more intently as You continue to talk to me specifically through my family. Guide me to a better understanding of Your plan. Keep us focused on You. AMEN

Would they say you were loving...would they say you had multiple personalities.... would they even know through your actions that you were a Christian at all?

In the scripture reference today, we see the sacrifice that Balaam's donkey was willing to sacrifice in order for his master to be protected. He was willing to go through beatings and ridicule in hopes of saving the one that he cared for the most. He saw the destruction that was ahead for his master and tried to do everything that he could to change the path, but the master wanted to continue down the path of destruction. Would our pets be willing to sacrifice their lives for us? If they saw death and destruction in front of us, would they risk it all in hopes of saving us?

I know that might sound crazy today. I know that we say they are just pets... but what I am saying goes back to the simplest message spoken by Jesus, "Whatever you do for the least of these..." They have no protection but us. They show us the unconditional love of God and we just blow right past it every day. They wag their tales, lick our faces, hear our cries, and lift our spirits even when we treat them worse than death. God is watching all of our actions, even to the least... It is time we beginning recognizing some of God's unseen gifts and help show love through even our relationships with our pets..or even strays. This is a message even for the strongest of hearts that if we really think about it could truly humble our lives.

God, man have we missed it. You continue to show us grace and mercy through every aspect of Your creation. Help us to see the simplest signs of love that You give us each day. Help us to instill this lesson into the minds of our family as well the next time we take out our hostility on the indefensible lives of Your blessings. AMEN

It is the day, March 14th or 3/14 every year that they have the opportunity to celebrate that PI is a mathematical constant that is the ration of a circle's circumference to its' diameter, and is ALWAYS the same number no matter which circle you try to compute. So in other words, PI is constant and never changing. WOW... This number that is derived in ancient Egypt and Babylon still remains the same today. Mathematicians claim that PI is an infinite decimal. The numbers to the right of the decimal never repeat and they will go on forever. If you don't believe me than google 'digits of pi' and see how far they will go.

Funny how we put so much faith and trust in a number and how little value we really believe in the amazing story of God. In understanding our scripture verse for the day, Paul is writing to the people of Philippi about having a better understanding of what we are called to do. We are called to get a bigger piece of the pie and no matter how big life gets that time and effort to understand God is a constant. One of the most difficult things that we fail to understand is that God is calling us to strive to do better. We are failing to understand that God does have a plan of victory for our lives and for the lives of our families. That is a constant. There is no questioning what God has in store for the family, because ever since the beginning of time God created the family and saw it as VERY GOOD. We have already seen that this week. The major question is whether or not we believe it enough to take hold of the plans God does have in store for us.

Think about that today... eat a piece of pie, buy a piece of pie for someone else that you may not even know, and when they ask you why you did that simply answer because God has something better in store for them and let them know that pie is just the beginning. The crazy thing is our lives changed on 3/14/20, but we all found a new constant through the gift of LOVE God was able to give to us through the ultimate sacrifice of His Son Jesus. Share that constant with your family today. That the God or EVERYTHING was willing to stop and give up EVERYTHING for SOMETHING as small as you. Now that's a tough bite to swallow.

God, help us to continue to focus on You and Your plan for our lives. Help us to extend the meaning of that love to our families and to everyone that we meet. You were willing to give us not just a piece of pie but the whole thing, and instead of saying thank you, we just want more. Humble our hearts and spirits in an ability to teach our future generations the importance of having You in our lives on a daily basis. AMEN

When You Look in the Mirror, What Do You See?

### \*Read todays scriptures:

It amazes me that we only have 15 days left in Phase 2... Where did the time go? In looking back over the last few months, we have been able to truly see where we stand with our families. In looking in the mirror, all of us have an opportunity to see glimpses of the people we use to be and the people that God is continuing to mold us to be. I know that there are days that I wake up and look in the mirror and say, WOW... When did this happen? But all in all we are able to get a clear look at the person that we are becoming.

As Paul is finishing up his letter about love, we see that the mirror plays a very valuable role in the means of moving forward. When Paul writes that we know in part and prophesy in part, our lives or only half full of what we need them to be filled with on a daily basis. When we only go through life listening to the Gospel and never studying the Word for our own personal growth, we are only able to tell what we have heard and only have partial authority of the scripture. However, when we finally reach maturity and recognize the fullness of God in our lives, we are able to have our half meet the other half of God and we reach the point of being complete. We see a poor reflection of the person we use to be... of the child that was trying to find answers, but now on this journey, we have come face to face with our strengths, struggles, weaknesses, and opportunities to build a stronger foundation with God. We have now started to leave the elementary teachings behind and hopefully desire to take and consume more solid portions of God's Word.

As people know you and your family, I hope and pray the first impression they have is wow that family is a Godoy family. I hope and pray that people will know your name and help to place it in conversation as one who is striving to give all they can to strengthen their family and their community for God. When you look in the mirror are you depressed at what you see because you continue to say... what if... or maybe I could.. instead of saying, I love the picture I see. One of the greatest lines I have heard about reflecting God is that every time we look in a mirror we should be able to see less of us and more of Him. We must decrease He must increase... The mirror never lies.

\*Is there something that you and your family is completely snared in that you cannot even see that may trap or cause you to fall?

\*In reading the scriptures in 1 John, how do you see the opportunities around you that God is supplying that your family may have to share love.

\*Sit down with your family and have a conversation on setting your daily schedule that includes your inviting God and your family to the table..

Lord, begin to prepare our hearts and minds for the journey we as a family are about to take. Help us to focus on Your example of love and help us to move into an attitude of Christ. As we have read, we know love because Christ "loved" us first, with no strings attached. Help us to continue that attitude of love in our daily lives. Now, also understand that he was not trying to replace Jesus, but he was trying to meet the people where they were and help them gain a better understanding of the life God had in store for them. He was willing to do this with complete strangers... I am only asking that we do this with our family.

Do you still have any doubts or questions about the foundations of your family? If so, today is the day that you need to spend time talking to them about God. After 140 days, you should have a better understanding about the love, grace and mercy of God. All I am asking is to get on their level and spend time truly building a firm foundation. I am not asking you to go outside your walls and have to speak to strangers. Understand that this is going to be an epic battle of spiritual warfare every day of your life and and I hope you are prepared not just to win one day... but to glorify God on every day.

In trying to continue in our journey together, have you stopped and ultimately asked God to speak to you, or have you just said, you know if God has something to say I am sure that He will get my attention. Strangely enough, even though He does not need it, maybe God is waiting on an invitation to be invited into the conversation. We must be willing to help them understand the importance of training our families in the foundational lessons given to us by God. We must help them to understand the importance of why we as Christians must help the world to see the importance of living a life for God..

So as we continue to walk this week with Jesus. I hope and pray that you take the time to understand the transcending power of God and the grace that was shed on the cross. I hope and pray that we all see the importance of Jesus' victory over sin and death that He endured in hopes of giving us a promise of eternal life for the future.

God, please give us the chance to teach our family the importance of this week. Help us to make every day of our lives something that continues to focus everything back to You. As we walk along this journey with You, may we once again focus on the importance of telling the real meaning of the sacrifice you made through Christ which has transcended our lives way beyond anything we could have ever imagined. Temptation to End Early
\*Read todays scriptures:



I was amazed today to hear this story again. I love how we can hear the same scriptures over and over again and finally get a new meaning from the words at different points of our lives. As we wake up today, we are facing 5 days until the end of Phase 2. I know that might sound crazy, but here is really where the toughest part of the battle begins. We see the finish line from our 60 days of Phase 2 and we begin to hear the voices telling us just how good of a job we have done over the last 55 days. We hear voices telling us that the end is near and it is ok for us to stop now because what could really happen in the next few days that hasn't already happened for us over the last 55 days.

It was amazing to think that we are standing here with Jesus. On the last days of His 40 day journey in the wilderness, satan appeared and tried everything he could to stop Jesus from accomplishing God's task for Him. Satan did not begin tempting Jesus on the first days of His fasting because he knew that Jesus would be too strong, but in reality satan waited until Jesus could see the light at the end of the tunnel to begin whispering in His ear that it would be ok for Him to give up all of this and take His rightful place of authority. Instead of letting go and giving in, Jesus rebuked satan with the power of the Word of God and completely drew strength from God.

Today, is that what satan is doing for us? Has he waited to the last days of our journey to cause us to rethink life back in the old way? Is he trying to get us to give up when the finish line is in site? It is almost as if he wants us to quit early and tells us we have done such a good job, when the prize is still yet to be found. In both scripture verses we read today tell the same story. The only difference is the one in Luke adds a little more detail at the end. In verse 13 of Luke 4, satan leaves Jesus to return and tempt Him again at a more opportune time. That opportune time... Is this week. Satan will be there as Jesus is completely exhausted in the garden... Satan will be there as Jesus is being beaten and arrested... Satan will be there as Jesus is being lead to Golgotha... and Satan will be there when Jesus is hanging on the cross. Satan saw Jesus was too strong in the beginning and waits to see Jesus completely beaten down before he will strike again. During this week, I hope and pray that you will see the sacrifice you have made. I pray that you will finish strongly your time of Phase 2 and get back up if you stumbled and fell to the temptation to quit. God has something in store for you, but He knows how easy it will be in the last days to fall to the temptation of satan to quit early.

God, give us the strength to endure. Help us to see the finish line and hold on strong to our commitment to You. When satan gathers around us these last few days, may we continue to grow stronger in our walk and hold true to Your Word. AMEN

### \*Read todays scriptures:

His sacrifice is a price paid for future debts, and we need to quit denying the fact that we have all denied the Father in one way or another and we must refocus on trying to get past our place at the table and realize the sacrifice that was made. TEACH YOUR CHILDREN THE MEANING OF COMMUNION and share in that moment TODAY!

God, help us. We are just like Judas. We may not receive 30 pieces of silver, but God we may betray You because of our wants and desires. Help us to stop saying "Surely not I", and help us to say, "Forgive me Lord for I know not what I do." Help us to share the importance of the sacrifice of Christ today. The King is COMING. AMEN

### \*Read todays scriptures:

Here we stand, 59 days later and we have been able to grow closer in our walk. For the last 150 days we have been challenged with spending time to share the love of God with those who may have no idea what true love resembles. We have been challenged with spending time with our families and trying to help them see that God is not restricted to a Sunday school or worship service. A bridge between the separation of us and God had been built, and family took on a new meaning. We celebrate this day as a marker of death, but what we must realize is that what Jesus meant by "It is finished" is that the debt had finally been paid in full...for ALL DEBT. This is not a marker for His life to be over, but a finishing marker for the sinful lives that we are living. Celebrate the day as we remember the day that we received the greatest gift of all from God the Father.

God, our prayer is one of thanksgiving for this day. Even though it marked a day we at first thought as loss, we realize now the victory that occurred. Help us to see the opportunity to teach our families the importance of this DAILY GIFT of grace and sacrifice. AMEN
